**Romans 8:26-28**

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26 In the same way, the Spirit helps us in our weakness. We do not know what we ought to pray for, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us with groans that words cannot express. 27 And he who searches our hearts knows the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints in accordance with God's will.

28 And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him,<sup>[a]</sup> who<sup>[b]</sup> have been called according to his purpose.

1. What do you pray for the most?
2. Why do you pray?
3. Where or from who did you learn to pray, or why do you pray as you do?
4. How do you feel about your personal prayer life? Confident? Doubtful? Competent or incompetent?
5. Romans 8.26-28 talks about the Spirit interceding for us with groans that cannot be expressed--what does this groaning feel like to you?
6. How does it make you feel to know that the Apostle Paul says, "We do not know what we ought to pray for?"
7. How was this passage meant to encourage us to pray more?
